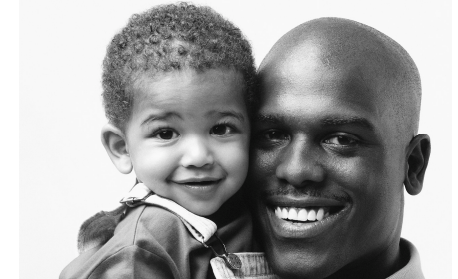

The Caswell County Partnership for Children is the local Smart Start agency. Smart Start programs and services provide children age five and under and not yet in kindergarten access to high quality and affordable child care, family support, and other critical services for families of young children. Smart Start reaches children during the most critical years of development, with the intent that they arrive at school healthy, motivated, and ready to learn.

In addition to financial support from Smart Start, the Caswell County Partnership for Children receives funds from private, state and federal grants as well as private contributions.



Programs for Families & Child Care Providers:

Child Care Resource & Referral (CCR&R)

Works with regulated child care providers to improve their site's star rating by providing technical assistance and trainings. Also assists new child care providers in becoming licensed.

Helps families find child care by providing information about quality indicators, state regulations, and how to choose care, and by matching families with child care programs that meet their needs.
