Training Title: Sunbeatables Sun Safety

This 2 Contact Hour Credit (CHC) is presented by Sandra Hudspeth and Bridget Bernal of CCPFC. Ray and the Sunbeatables: A Sun Safety Curriculum is a program that educates children, teachers and parents about sun protection and promotes sun safety behaviors in an effort to reduce children's lifetime risk of developing skin cancer.

Training Title: ITS-SIDS

This 2 Contact Hour Credit (CHC) is presented by Amanda Hazen, Infant Toddler Specialist with Child Care Services Association. This training meets the Division of Child Development and Early Education health and safety requirements. This workshop gives child care providers an overview of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome, identifies SIDS risk factors, and describes ways to reduce the risk of SIDS in child care. Target Audience-directors, infant and toddler teachers, and family child care providers.

Since tooth decay is the most common chronic disease of childhood, the purpose of this training is to provide information to assist caregivers and those who influence caregivers to understand the dental needs of young children, implement healthy habits in the childcare environment, and encourage parents to establish a dental home so that young children will suffer less oral disease.

Training Title: Play: An Intervention for Challenging Behavior

This 0.5 Continuing Education Unit (CEU) is presented by Nicole Randall, Education Specialist with Child Care Resources, Inc. Challenging behaviors come in many different formats and many different levels of intensity in preschool children. A significant percentage of teachers report more challenging behaviors in their classroom and frustration in their knowledge and ability to work with these children. At the same time, skills once expected in kindergarten are being

pushed down into preschool, so demands on teachers and children are higher. Play is disappearing. Forty years of research says play equals learning. In this session, we will PLAY as we discuss the importance of play for all children, how play can serve as an intervention for children with challenging behavior, Dr. Stanley Greenspan's Floortime concept, how play meets developmentally appropriate learning goals, and creative ways teachers can explain the importance of play to parents.

Training Title: Resilience: How Childhood Trauma Affects Health Across a Lifetime

This 2 CHC is presented by Julie Budd, Volunteer Outreach Coordinator with CrossRoads Sexual Assault Response & Resource Center and Child Advocacy Center. Training will include a video documentary with discussion. The goal and objective of this training is to provide the latest research on adverse childhood experiences (ACES) to professionals so that they can make wise decisions. When we understand the significance of traumas like child sexual abuse or witnessing domestic violence, we will be more ready to stop them in our communities and in the families we work with. Plus we will be better equipped to work with children with high ACE scores. This research is used to work across disciplines to be trauma informed and to adopt policies that best serve all our children.

Training Title: Leaping Into Literacy

This 2 CHC is presented by Chandra Barbour of Little Destiny Literacy Center. Children introduced to reading early on tend to read earlier and excel in school compared to children who are not exposed to language and books at a young age. Developing early literacy skills makes it easier for children to learn to read. Children who enter school with these skills have an advantage that carries with them throughout their school years. However, more than 1 in 3 American children enter Kindergarten without the skills they need to learn to read (American Academy of Pediatrics). Reading is an essential skill for success in school and later in life. Objectives of this training include: creating a print rich environment, connecting books to curriculum and instruction, introducing and connecting books to all discovery areas in the classroom, and discussing and determining how literacy is important in the early childhood classroom.

Training Title: Emergency Preparedness and Response
